



This watercolor workshop will focus on color power, composition and the creative process of converting subject sketches and photographs into personal and meaningful statements. Instruction will cover design principles and the basics of watercolor painting, with an emphasis on subject connection, storyline and simplifying shapes and values and the use of energetic color. Each day will begin with a demonstration painting, followed by brief concept exercises and lots of personal painting time. There will be daily critiques, and whether individual or group, they will be positive and honest, and are always intended to support and inspire. In joyfully sharing his experience as a professional artist, Carl's goal is to encourage students to find and engage their own personal and creative spirits.


Brushstroke Changes



The Exhibitions Committee for this year, 2012-2013, Pat Bonneau-White, Jan Addy and Mary McCoy, wish to extend our greetings to you. We look forward to a fun year and encourage all of you to participate in one or more of the exhibition opportunities being offered this coming year.

Fall 2012 Member "Stretch" Show

Artist, Krystyna Robbins of El Paso, will jury the SC Fall Show, Stretch, at the Tombaugh Gallery. Stretch will feature watercolor pieces created "outside the box" and allow entrants to explore different means of creativity not normally accepted. Because several "stretches" have been announced at different times, here is a complete list of those that may be included in your paintings:

- · Painting may extend onto the mat
- Flat items may be added to painting surface, relief of no greater thickness that 1/16 inch
- Hand-colored/commercially prepared papers may be used as part of the composition
- Canvas or Aquaboard may be used, framed without a mat or Plexiglas and coated with a clear acrylic coating.
- · Mats, if used, may be colored or neutral toned.

Please also note that the revised prospectus does not include the Tombaugh contract. The Exhibitions Committee has incorporated those items from the contract that will affect your submissions into the prospectus. All artists in the show will be asked to sign a half page agreement for insurance purposes at Intake, however.
