September NMWS presentation—Rex Barron "From the Pink Panther to Picture Books, an Illustrator's Perspective"

Rex worked for 11 years as an animator and layout artist in the animation studios of Los Angeles, then changed over to illustrating and writing children's books. He did 7 books for G. P. Putnam's Sons from 1992-2004. Using a wealth of materials, from beginning



thumbnails to final art, the process of illustrating a manuscript will be analyzed. Rex's first children's illustration project, <u>Eggbert, the Slightly Cracked Egg</u>, has sold almost 100,000 copies, and his books have been translated into several languages. In 1997 he won a Children's Book Choice award from the International Reading Association.

Thanks too for Donna Dionne's outstanding service in recent (and not so recent) years-her significant contributions to NMWS for a number of years have kept us thriving, and she will be greatly missed! We still REALLY need someone(s) to step up as Exhibitions Chair. This position is essential for us to have two shows a year and without a replacement for Toni Seidel who has served us well, we will surely need to cut back our current activity. We also still lack a Membership VP, Treasurer (for now, we are using our funds to pay someone to do this), Chair for the Social committee, and we still have people serving in multiple positions. Any of these positions could be shared by a couple people, so if you are not feeling up to taking one on by yourself, see if you can't find a friend willing to take it on with you.

We are a large organization with a history of many great activities, but it takes more than a few willing volunteers to make the activities happen. Simply put, without more volunteers, we will have fewer activities. How will you like having just one exhibition a year, or none? How will you like having no snacks or beverages at our meetings? How do we continue to recruit new members if we aren't welcoming those who come now? Would you rather use our funds to offer more benefits to our members than to pay a Treasurer? Or will our dues have to increase if we have to offer pay or other incentives to recruit people willing to serve on the Board? Come see the Permanent Collection

We have a golden opportunity to view the Permanent Collection of the NMWS on Friday, September 28. While part of the collection can be seen at our juried shows each year, this is an opportunity to see all of the paintings at one time.

The collection was started over 40 years ago. Most of the watercolors in it have been done by nationally recognized artists who were invited to jury our shows and teach workshops here in Albuquerque. Several outstanding watercolors were donated by members from their private collections and a few were given to the NMWS by past presidents. All of these paintings are worth studying and can add to our education and appreciation of our chosen media.

Having these paintings hung at REDW has been far better than keeping them tucked away in a storage facility as was previously done, but due to the necessity for quiet at this local accounting firm, it has been difficult to arrange for us to have access to the paintings. This opportunity is a first and hopefully, depending on how it goes, not the last. Becoming familiar with the watercolors will help each of us make wise decisions as we begin to discuss the future of the collection.

If you want to join us on the 28th it is essential that your name be on the visitors' list. That list was begun at the July meeting and will again be circulated at the September 17th meeting. This watercolor workshop will focus on color power, composition and the creative process of converting subject sketches and photographs into personal and meaningful statements. Instruction will cover design principles and the basics of watercolor painting, with an emphasis on subject connection, storyline and simplifying shapes and values and the use of energetic color. Each day will begin with a demonstration painting, followed by brief concept exercises and lots of personal painting time. There will be daily critiques, and whether individual or group, they will be positive and honest, and are always intended to support and inspire. In joyfully sharing his experience as a professional artist, Carl's goal is to encourage students to find and engage their own personal and creative spirits.
